Michael (Mike) John Schuler, 73, of Lake Havasu City, Arizona passed away in his home on Tuesday, October 13, 2020.

Mike was born in Los Angeles, California on August 24, 1947; son of Arthur and Virginia Schuler. He graduated from high school and then spent 1967-1971 serving his country in the Air Force.
